

**Intervention:**

- When appropriate, change student's assigned computer; check headphones.
- Using Y-adapter, listen as student works.
- Explain exercise/practice in Demo Mode.
- Show student Success Viewer; for next day, challenge him/her to work on my difficult exercise "second."
- Print summary report (5 days) for each student; weekly share with students & classroom teachers.
- Print and share error reports with students and/or classroom teachers.

**Motivation:**

- Teach students the success indicators on the screen for each exercise.
- After first two weeks, offer incentives/reward program.
- Vary the routine: Monday: Work in Socks Tuesday: Double Points in One Exercise Wednesday: Dim Lights Thursday: Prize for Increased Points Friday: Color/Create Percent Complete Chart
- Completion Certificate: Print; cut into 4ths; award ¼ as students qualify; glue in Fast ForWord folders.
- Highlight first students progressing from one product to another with a photo poster in the lab!

**Book Monkeys**



**Directions:** Click the book with the yellow paw to start the exercise; Read the paragraph and answer the questions by clicking the best answer.

- The librarian asks a question and other monkeys display possible answers on note cards.
- The participant must click the response that best answers the question.
- Points are awarded for each correct answer, and bonus points are awarded when the participant answers 10 trials correctly.

Book Monkeys helps develop working memory, vocabulary, and reading comprehension, skills that help students read and understand extended blocks of text.

**Canine Crew**



**Directions:** Click the yellow paw to start the exercise; Match the word pairs displayed on the bricks according to the instructions given.

- There is one brick that doesn't have a match.
- Points are awarded for each correct answer, and bonus points are awarded after ten correct trials.
- When there are no more bricks in the wheelbarrow, the participant can still click the matching bricks until the grid is cleared, they just don't earn points.

Canine Crew helps develop decoding and the ability to recognize and match rhymes, synonyms, antonyms and homophones, which are critical skills for achieving reading fluency.



**Scrap Cat**



**Directions:** Click the yellow paw on Scrap Cat’s t-shirt to start the exercise; Click the category bin that best matches the word written on the can or bottle.

- The participant can click the speaker next to each category bin to hear the category read aloud.
- Points are awarded for each correct answer. When the participant answers 10 trials correctly, bonus points are awarded and a reward animation plays.
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Scrap Cat helps develop the ability to recognize and sort similar groups of words into distinct categories, a crucial skill for becoming a flexible and fluent reader.

**Chicken Dog**

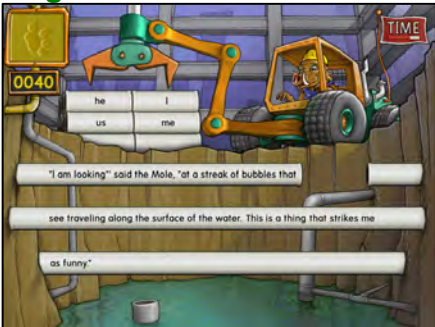


**Directions:** Click the yellow paw to start the exercise; Click the letter combination that completes the spelling of the presented word.

- A hot dog is presented with an incomplete target word displayed on it.
- Points are awarded for each correct answer, and bonus points are awarded after 10 correct answers.
- To hear the target word pronounced again, the participant can click the paw. This does not affect points.
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Chicken Dog helps develop phonology and letter-sound association, which are important, fundamental reading skills.

**Hog Hat Zone**



**Directions:** Click the yellow paw to start the exercise; Click the word that best fits the gap in the paragraph shown on the pipes and girders.

- Three to four choices for the first missing word are displayed on pipes or girders at the top of the screen.
- New choices will appear for the second blank.
- Points are awarded for each correct answer, and bonus points are awarded after 10 correct answers (a trial is one blank space in the paragraph).

Hog Hat Zone helps develop the use and recognition of pronouns, auxiliary verbs, prefixes and suffixes in extended text.

**Twisted Pictures**



**Directions:** Click the painting of the yellow paw to start the exercise; Click the sentence that best represents the painting.

- Click the sentence that best describes what is happening in the painting.
- Points are awarded for each correct answer, and bonus points are awarded after 10 correct answers.

Twisted Pictures helps develop the ability to recognize the structures and patterns of sentence formation, which is important for proficient grammar and reading comprehension.
